### **JUNE 17**

---

Travelers will find their way up to New Haven, CT, either on their own or by hopping on the Amtrak in Wilmington with Executive Director Molly Giordano.

Once in New Haven, guests will have free time to unpack and get some lunch before heading to the Yale Center for British Art for a private tour.

After the tour, explore the museum some more, walk over to the Yale University Art Gallery to catch another great collection, or stroll around the campus before gathering for a DelArt group dinner.

### **JUNE 18**

After breakfast the group will take a chartered bus to the Norman Rockwell Museum where you'll enjoy another private tour and lunch. Afterwards, you'll get back on the bus and head to The Porches Inn in North Adams, MA.

This charming hotel will be your home base for the final two nights. So unpack and spend the free evening exploring the town.

Then, the evening is yours. Catch transportation back to the hotel, or head out and enjoy the night! A weekend evening in the summer offers many options for all types of people. From live music to a fantastic meal; DelArt will have you nice and prepared with all of the events going on around the town closer to the trip.

### **JUNE 19**

After breakfast at the hotel, the group will head over to The Clark Art Institute for a private tour, following by free time for lunch and further exploration. In the afternoon the group will travel to the Williams College Museum of Art, followed by time to relax at the hotel before a group dinner.

### **JUNE 20**

---

After breakfast, the group will visit MASS MoCA, one of the largest contemporary art centers in the country. Enjoy free time after the tour to further explore the museum. In the mid-afternoon, a chartered bus will take the group to Boston to end the journey. The bus will drop you off either at the airport, or at a designated hotel if you plan to continue your journey after the DelArt trip ends.
